House Plants

¥Mix 1/2-cup of small pebbles and 3 rusty nails in potting soil when you plant small cuttings. The pebbles keep the soil loose and allows roots to spread better; the nails add iron and minerals to the soil.

¥For shiny healthy leaves on house plants, clean each leaf every two weeks with a cotton ball dipped into mayonnaise.

¥If your plants are sitting in direct sunlight, be sure to turn

the pot around every few days to promote even growth.

¥Soak rice in different colors of food coloring and sprinkle around the bases of artificial flower arrangements to hide the styrofoam blocks these flowers are set in.

¥To help plants grow in a room that doesn't have sunlight, replace your light bulb with one of the new fluorescent bulbs.
